Access free and reduced cost public transportation when you can	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• See whether you qualify for <a href="#">discounted bus fare</a> with KAT as a senior, disabled person, Medicare card holder, or with another status</li><li>• For children in Knox County, take advantage of <a href="#">KAT's Youth Freedom Pass</a> to get free bus rides around town</li><li>• Access low-cost public transportation to access employment, medical care, and more via Knoxville and Knox County's <a href="#">Community Action Committee transportation programs</a></li><li>• For transportation outside of Knox County, look into programs like:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ <a href="#">ETHRA Public Transit</a> (East Tennessee)</li><li>◦ <a href="#">Lakeway Transit</a> (Morristown)</li><li>◦ <a href="#">Oak Ridge Transit</a></li></ul></li></ul>
Explore alternate transportation options to save on gas money, exercise, and be active in your community	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Join the free <a href="#">Knoxville Regional Smart Trips</a> program to earn rewards for walking, biking, taking the bus, carpooling, and working from home instead of driving alone.</li><li>• Look into <a href="#">Two Bikes</a> to find cheap bike repairs, community biking events, and opportunities to donate bikes or request a free bike for yourself or someone you know is in need via their <a href="#">Pedal It Forward</a> program</li></ul>

## Regional Leaders

Resource	Summary
<a href="#">East TN Clean Fuels</a>	Nonprofit that offers education on alternative-fuel vehicles and provides free technical support to public and private partners through programs such as Green Fleets and grants.
<a href="#">Drive Electric TN</a>	Nonprofit that offers education on electric vehicles and provides free technical support to public and private partners through programs such as EMPOWER (workplace charging).
<a href="#">City of Knoxville</a>	Manages free public chargers at 13 locations across Knoxville.
TN Department of Transportation	Installs public EV chargers (particularly in rural areas) via <a href="#">TN Electric Vehicle Infrastructure</a> program.
<a href="#">Knoxville Area Transit (KAT)</a>	Regional transit agency that offers reduced fare for eligible riders and discounts for bulk ticket purchases.
<a href="#">Bike Walk Knoxville</a>	Advocates for safer walking and biking in Knoxville
<a href="#">Two Bikes</a>	Nonprofit offering job training, free transportation opportunities, bike repair, and a community of cyclists with frequent biking events
